## IN THE MATTER OF AFFIRMATIVE ACTION PLAN



Commissioner Mickley advised he researched the Affirmative Action Plan last year when it came up. He found in 1973 Congress passed the Comprehensive Employment & Training Act (CETA) which was a jobs program. One of the requirements was an Affirmative Action Plan in the counties that participated, so the Commissioners implemented the Plan in 1978. In 1982, CETA was repealed and replaced by the Job Training Partnership Act (JTPA) which was then replaced by the Workforce Investment Act (WIA). WIA was repealed and replaced by the Workforce Innovation & Opportunity Act (WIOA) which is the current workforce program run through the Area 16 Workforce Development Board. When WIOA was put into law, the Department of Labor's Civil Rights Center declined to include a requirement for an Affirmative Action Plan citing that there were already plenty of rules, regulations and laws at the state and federal levels to ensure equal opportunity, etc. Commissioner Mickley feels the Plan is redundant and outdated. Janice E. Leggett, Commissioners' Clerk Supervisor, advised the Plan had already been sent to the Prosecutor for an opinion. The Board reviewed the April 12, 2017 opinion. Commissioner Ohler asked if any of these issues were covered by the current personnel policy manual. Ms. Leggett provided a copy of the manual which includes unlawful discrimination and equal opportunity. Commissioner Wirkner pointed out that the Plan can be amended and the Prosecutor advised the Board to maintain the Plan. Commissioner Wirkner

#### **FLOODING**

## EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY



Tom Cottis, Emergency Management Agency Director, appeared before the Board to clarify the difference between Lake Mohawk and Mohawk Dam. He advised there was some flooding in the Riverview Drive area in Brown Township. Residents went to the Muskingum Watershed website to see about lake levels, and they saw Mohawk Dam was releasing water. However, Mohawk Dam is located in Warsaw, Coshocton County. Lake Mohawk in Brown Township is a non-regulated lake through the Army Corps of Engineers and is not listed on the Muskingum Watershed website. Mr. Cottis spoke with Lake Mohawk officials who confirmed the Lake is not releasing any water at this time. The flooding in the Riverview Drive area was the result of surface runoff and pooling water from the amount of snow and rain received. The Sandy Creek was over its banks, but Lake Mohawk did not release any water. Commissioner Ohler advised this information should be sent to the resident or residents who have complained along with a copy to the Brown Township Trustees. Commissioner Wirkner suggested adding Lake Mohawk officials to the list and providing a copy of these minutes to everyone. Commissioner Wirkner asked what the role of EMA is with flood plain. Mr. Cottis explained the focus is mitigation, response and recovery. Mr. Cottis advised FEMA requires flood plain regulations which were adopted by the Commissioners. Part of the mitigation process was a buyout of the Riverview Drive area but some residents opted to stay. The flood plain zone through that area has not changed since 1972. Maps are available through the EMA office. Commissioner Ohler asked about the flood plain regulations. Mr. Cottis answered that the regulations were adopted to keep insurance costs at a minimum, and the regulations mirror FEMA.


