A RESOLUTION DETERMINING TO PROCEED WITH THE SUBMISSION TO THE ELECTORS OF THE QUESTION OF LEVYING A TAX IN EXCESS OF THE TEN-MILL LIMITATION ORC 5705.19, ORC 5705.191, ORC 5705.25, ORC 5705.26

The <u>Board of Commissioners</u> of <u>Carroll</u> County, Ohio, met in <u>regular</u> session on the <u>10th</u> day of <u>May</u>, 20<u>18</u>, at the office of <u>the Board of County Commissioners</u>, with the following members present: <u>Robert E. Wirkner, Lewis A. Mickley, and Jeffrey L.</u> <u>Ohler</u>.

Mr. Mickley moved the adoption of the following Resolution:

WHEREAS, on the <u>7th</u> day of <u>May</u>, <u>2018</u>, this Board adopted a resolution determining to submit to the electors of <u>Carroll</u> <u>County</u>, the question of levying a tax in excess of the ten-mill limitation, as described below, a copy of which resolution was certified to the County Auditor of Carroll County; and

WHEREAS, the County Auditor has certified to this Board that the total current tax valuation of <u>Carroll County</u> is <u>\$900,920,130.00</u>, and the dollar amount of revenue that will be produced annually by the millage stated below would be <u>\$430,000.00</u>.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of Carroll County, Ohio, that:

Section 1. This Board desires and determines to proceed with the submission to the electors of the question of levying a tax in excess of the ten-mill limitation for the benefit of providing or maintaining senior citizens services or facilities (Friendship Center) as authorized by Section 307.694 or 307.85 of the Ohio Revised Code and pursuant to Ohio Revised Code 5705.19(Y), at a rate not exceeding 0.5 mills for each one dollar of valuation, which amounts to five (5) cents for each one hundred dollars of valuation for five (5) years (2019, 2020, 2021, 2022, and 2023), and which levy is a renewal of an existing levy of 0.5 mills.

Section 2. The question of approving the levy shall be submitted to the electors of <u>Carroll County</u>, <u>Ohio</u> at the election to be held on the 6^{th} day of <u>November</u>, 2018, and that said levy be placed on the tax lists of the current tax year, commencing in 2019 first due in calendar year 2020 in compliance with the provisions of ORC 5705.34, if a majority of the electors voting thereon vote in favor thereof.

Section 3. The Clerk of this Board is directed to certify a copy of this resolution to the Board of Elections of <u>Carroll County, Ohio</u>, not less than ninety days before the election, and notify said Board of Elections to cause notice of election on the question of levying said tax to be given as required by law.

Section 4. Auditor Lynn Fairclough appeared before the Board to advise she attended the monthly Auditors Association meeting on Friday and learned House Bill 430 had passed the House, there have been three meetings in the Senate, and a potential Committee vote is slated for Wednesday. She explained the Bill modifies the sales tax exemption for equipment used in oil and gas exploration and production and it is being asked to be retroactive to 2010. Ms. Fairclough asked if the Board had taken any action. Commissioner Wirkner advised they were aware of the Bill, and he had spoken with the County Commissioners' Association of Ohio (CCAO) on Friday. They are waiting to hear from the author and co-author of the Bill to see if an amendment would be entertained. Commissioner Wirkner explained if an amendment was not forthcoming, then CCAO would direct the Commissioners to prepare a response. Ms. Fairclough feels the County needs to be proactive. Commissioner Ohler asked what the financial ramifications are. Ms. Fairclough did not know because we don't get to see those reports. Ms. Fairclough advised she just wanted to bring this to the attention of the Commissioners and suggested they get in contact with someone about it. Commissioner Ohler advised he had reached out to State Representative Andy Thompson already. Ms. Fairclough advised the Legislative Service Commission estimated this expanded tax break would cost the state, local governments and libraries more than \$50 million in fiscal year 2019 because it is retroactive to 2010 and \$5.1 million a year after that.

IN THE MATTER OF **COMMUNITY HOUSING IMPACT & PRESERVATION (CHIP) PY15** MARY PASSWATERS 🔰 9:45 AM

Attending this meeting were Prosecutor Steven Barnett, Environmental Health Director Scott Lenigan, Health Department Board Member Thomas White, and Health Department Board Member Sean Speedy. The Board opted not to enter into executive session to discuss this matter as the Board does not have the ability to initiate court action at this point. Commissioner Ohler advised the County has funds in the CHIP Program Income to pay for a new well, but the question is whether the new well can be drilled without first closing the current wells. Commissioner Wirkner advised he sees two dynamics at work: (1) a resident with no water with the County committing available funds for a new well, and (2) code violations beyond this Board's ability to address. Mr. Lenigan explained there are two firm code violations, being the driller did not submit a log or ceiling report to the Health Department and the two wells were drilled too close together. The remedy would be for the Health Department to issue orders to correct the violations giving the driller a certain time period to provide an action plan to seal the wells and drill a new one to code; if he fails to do that, a bond claim can be initiated. Mr. Speedy advised they are waiting to hear from the State on the official timeframe. Mr. Lenigan explained another option is for the driller to seal the first wells and refund the CHIP program what he was paid. Commissioner Wirkner asked if there is any temporary relief for the resident. Mr. Lenigan and Mr. Speedy answered there are companies that provide temporary holding tanks. Commissioner Ohler asked if there was a two-year timeframe for the bond. Mr. Lenigan said it is two years to initiate the process of the bond, and Mr. Speedy clarified it is two years from the date the well was completed. Mr. Lenigan advised this is already on the State's radar. Mr. Speedy explained this situation is a bit messy since the CHIP program hired the general contractor who hired the well driller so the homeowner made no decisions and paid out no funds for this. Prosecutor Barnett advised the documents he reviewed showed the contract was between the homeowner and the contractor with the Board just being the grant administrator. Mr. White feels this will not be resolved in a timely fashion because the well driller has just walked away, so litigation is likely. Commissioner Wirkner stated his opinion is the Board has their fingerprints on this and has an obligation to do whatever they can to straighten this out. Commissioner Wirkner asked if there is an action plan in place. Mr. Lenigan plans to get a letter out today to the driller outlining the violations and giving him ten days to respond and pull a permit; if the driller does not do anything, the homeowner and possibly the general contractor can file a bond claim through the State of Ohio. Mr. Lenigan will provide a step by step guide to the Board. Mr. Speedy cautioned everyone that until the process works its way through, the wells and the driller's work cannot be disturbed. Commissioner Mickley suggested reaching out to other organizations for short-term assistance with the resident's water. Commissioner Wirkner questioned if CHIP funds could be used. Janice Leggett, Commissioners' Clerk Supervisor, advised \$13,000 was earmarked to replace the well and the rest has been marked for other items which cannot be changed at this point. Those in attendance discussed other options for obtaining temporary water for the resident.
