Some topics reviewed were drone coverage, controlled substance cleanup, and the Loss Control Incentive Program. There is not expected to be an increase in last year's premium which was \$146,326.00. John Brownlee discussed HB 291 which was enacted as Ohio Revised Code §3.061 effective April 7, 2019. This will allow counties to obtain an employee dishonesty and faithful performance of duty policy in place of bonds. There are disagreements among legal counsel on when this would take effect for individuals with some saying immediately while others say at the beginning of a new term. If Commissioners choose the policy route through CORSA instead of bonds, a resolution will need to be passed and sent to CORSA. Mr. Brownlee advised the matter is being reviewed and his office will send out a formal bulletin in the next couple of weeks.

Chaela has completed their first year of the agreement. The Council recommends the Board of Commissioners to continue both enterprise zone agreements and finds Chaela Enterprises in compliance. Mr. Modranski reported that there is a service fee the can be charged to the property owners for expenses in conducting the abatement reviews. The fee must be equal to 1% of the amount of taxes exempted under the agreement, but not less than \$500 or more than \$2,500. Mr. Modranski advised there will still be a balance from the last time the fee was collected therefore the Council recommends suspending the collection of the service fee for 2019.
