Captain Keyser advised that they were approached about 3 months ago by a new EMS service that wanted to start up in Carroll County known as Regional EMS Incorporated. Orange Township has requested that we use them for their primary EMS service in that Emergency Service Network (ESN) zone for 9-1-1. Commissioner Wirkner clarified with Captain Keyser that the Orange Township trustees have voted in open session to accept this as their primary provider. Captain Keyser confirmed. There is no actual written contract, just an agreement between the EMS service and Orange Township trustees. Regional EMS Incorporated reached out to Captain Keyser last Friday and reported that they were ready to go. Captain Keyser advised them that it would need to come before the Commissioners. Captain Keyser reported to the Board that the Trustees have approved them; they have their licensing; and they are going to run full EMS squad services, not first responder services, for Orange Township. They have not approached the Village of Sherrodsville or Monroe Township yet but it is believed they are planning to serve the same emergency response area where the Sherrodsville EMS used to respond. Captain Keyser said this would provide a better response for EMS down in those areas. Commissioner Wirkner advised Captain Keyser that he would like to see a copy of the township minutes approving the ambulance service for her files. Christopher R. Modranski, Interim Clerk Supervisor questioned when the effective start date is. Captain Keyser advised that the start date was last Friday, however some administrative work needed to be completed first which she completed on Memorial Day, and that would have been their effective date. Nancy Schaar, from the Free Press Standard, asked who is running this service. Captain Keyser advised that Joel Decker is the CEO. Nancy asked if he still lives in South Carolina. Captain Keyser advised that he is back and forth, as he is fulfilling a contract in South Carolina. Commissioner Wirkner asked if they have had a call for service yet. Captain Keyser advised not yet. She entered all their information into the system, and then received an email that they won't be available until June 1. Captain Keyser advised that they will work through the issues because there is no EMS service in that area and the county desperately needs it. EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY UPDATE



Tom Cottis, Director, Emergency Management Agency, reported on the recent weather activity in the county, including a tornado on Saturday. Mr. Cottis advised there was some confusion with the notification to his office because we were not actually under a tornado warning at the time the damage was done. Originally The National Weather Service didn't look at it as a structural collapse due to the storm. Mr. Cottis advised that his first notification of the storm came from the media and that's when he went to the site and started an initial assessment. Mr. Cottis advised that he did call National Weather Service that night and they asked if he thought it was a tornado, he said absolutely, based on the twisting of trees at higher elevations. National Weather Service went back and looked at footage and determined that it did not start a rotation until it was over D & D Appliance. The storm had snapped a couple trees by Wendy's, the wind shear blew down the storage facility around their trash receptacles. When it came across Canton Road the rotation started and the damage to D & D Appliances was because of the vacuum of the rotation starting. It went down the hillside and when it hit the Becky-Lyn Mobile Home Park the first mobile home received the brunt of the damage lifting onto its side. The time on the ground was a very short with a very minimal burst and then lifted back off the ground. Mr. Cottis was able to tell by the damage as it went out across Route 9 it was still at an elevation that it was twisting trees, but it wasn't sucking down to the ground. Fred McMullin, Chief Meteorologist from Pittsburgh came over and evaluated the storm damage. Mr. McMullin told Mr. Cottis that if the tornado had stayed on the ground, we would have had major destruction. The damage reported is 1 home destroyed, a second home may end up destroyed, 5 impacted homes that damage is still questionable, 1 home with a limb through it, 20 homes reporting minor damage, and 2 businesses reported damage. D&D Appliances, and over by Heritage Plastics a roof came off and a transformer came off the pole. Mr. Cottis reported that we are saturated with rain and there is rain in the forecast through Saturday. Fortunately, there are breaks which helps with saturation. Mr. Cottis stated that this is ninth tornado to hit Carroll County since 1955, and the sixth since he has been director.

COMMUNITY HISTORIC PRESERVATION GRANT



Christopher R. Modranski, Interim Clerk Supervisor, appeared before the Board to discuss the progress report from the Malvern Historical Society. Mr. Modranski advised that during the March 7, 2019 Commissioners meeting the Board made a motion asking the Malvern Historical Society for a plan of action for the renovation of the Malvern Historical Society Building. Mr. Modranski reminded the Board that the Malvern Historical Society received funds from the Community Historic Preservation Grant to complete the renovation project in June 2017 but have failed to locate a contractor to complete the task. Mr. Modranski advised the Board that the Malvern Historical Society has provided a letter of notification on May 22, 2019 that a contractor has been selected to complete the project.

Christopher R. Modranski, Interim Clerk Supervisor, appeared before the Board to advise the County's Safety Committee met during their regular meeting on May 15, 2019. Mr. Modranski advised that the Safety Committee reviewed the tornado evacuation that took place on April 9, 2019. Mr. Modranski reviewed that the tornado siren was activated, and the decision was made to evacuate to the basement. The unplanned evacuation brought to light some issues: (a) the door to the basement was locked and no one had a key and (b) not everyone could hear the Page All over the phone system. Mr. Modranski advised the Page All feature has been updated to add

more phones to provide a better reach. The Safety Committee tabled a recommendation on installing a key fab lock on the basement door until more research could be completed on the matter. The Safety Committee recommended that the Sheriff's Office create a Wireless Emergency Notification System for county employees to receive emergency alerts. Mr. Modranski advised the Board has received a quote from TLC Technology, LLC to install a key fab lock and push in case of emergency exit system on the basement door which will be funded by the Courthouse Security Fund. Commissioner Wirkner advised that Sheriff Dale Williams received the quote and met with Municipal Court Judge Gary Willen to verify that this is a courthouse security issue. Judge Willen agreed that it is a courthouse security issue and approved using courthouse security funds to complete the project.

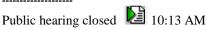

IN THE MATTER OF COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT PY19 PUBLIC HEARING

The time having arrived to conduct the first public hearing for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) PY19 Direct Allocation Program, Dale Hartle, President of the Ohio Regional Development Corporation opened the meeting. Those present were: Dale Hartle, President ORDG; Christopher R. Modranski, Fair Housing Coordinator/Interim Clerk Supervisor; Melissa Schaar, Assistant Clerk I; Valerie S. Mossor, Deputy Auditor; Commissioner Robert E. Wirkner; Commissioner Lewis A Mickley; Nancy Schaar, Free Press Standard; and Leigh Ann Rutledge, Carroll County Messenger. This is the 1st of 2 public hearings for the Allocation Program of 2019. The Allocation application has to go into the state of Ohio June 14 and is awarded in October or November 2019. There will be 2 years to administer what is awarded. Mr. Hartle advised that part of the allocation program is not competitive. The county is eligible for approximately \$120,000.00 of project funds, \$150,000.00 for all of the money which includes cost of administration and so forth. The county is eligible to do a maximum of 4 projects based on this amount of money the county receives. Mr. Hartle advised that they need the applications by June 7 and they go to the state on June 14. The allocation portion is guaranteed as long as the county has projects that meet the criteria that the state has. In addition to the \$150,000.00 of the 2019 Allocation, the county is also eligible for competitive grants that are tied to the 2019 Allocation. The Neighborhood Revitalization Grant for \$750,000 is a competitive grant for projects that improve the quality of life, livability and functionality in a neighborhood. This is primarily construction, reconstruction, or rehabilitation of public infrastructure. The application has to go to the state at the same time and is somewhat tied to the allocation grant. The Critical Infrastructure Grant is a competitive grant for \$500,000.00. The projects are designed to assist communities with high priority, single component projects, such as roads, flood drainage, and other public infrastructure types of things such as water lines, sewer lines, and sidewalks. This application is due at the same time as the allocation grant. Economic Development Loans and Public Infrastructure Grants are on an open funding cycle and not tied to the June 14 deadline. They are competitive and are available all throughout the coming year, as long as the state has money. The state's looking for things that will create long term jobs or to sustain existing jobs. The Residential Public Infrastructure Grant Program is a competitive grant for water and sewer. The Target of Opportunity (TOPP) Grant program includes competitive grants that are on an open funding cycle. The Downtown Revitalization Grant is a maximum of \$250,000.00; CDBG Target of Opportunity Grants Program; Homelessness Target of Opportunity Grant for supported housing for homeless crisis response. Christopher R. Modranski questioned if competitive grants have to be in a Low/Moderate Income area. Mr. Hartle responded that the Downtown Revitalization Grant is not necessarily tied to low to moderate income people. The Critical Infrastructure Grant is tied to Low/Moderate Income people. For example, if you are going to pave a street, then 51% of the people living on that street must be in Low/Moderate Income. An Industrial Park would fall under Economic Development Loans and Public Infrastructure Grants. You must have a client that is committed to coming in and jobs that meet the criteria. No speculative buildings. Mr. Hartle shared an experience with the employee requirements that he ran in to several years ago. If the person hired was employed the preceding 12 months and their income did not meet the Low/Moderate Income guideline for their household, then they did not meet the requirement.

FY19 CDBG DIRECT ALLOCATION PROGRAM



Dale Hartle, President of Ohio Regional Development Corporation discussed the application for the Allocation Program. The Allocation Program is primarily designed to benefit people that are low to moderate income. The overall application area must achieve at least a 51% Low/Moderate Income benefit or benefit one of the following categories of individuals: Abused Children, Battered Spouses, Elderly Persons, Handicapped persons, Homeless persons, Illiterate persons, Migrant farm workers, Persons living with AIDS or Severely disabled adults. Census data or income surveys are used to determine if the area is low to moderate income. If the project is to eliminate slums and blight, then building and infrastructure surveys could be required. Cost estimates must be submitted, and estimates must be certified by an independent party and they must detail material and labor costs. Any project costing over \$2,000.00 must have Davis-Bacon Prevailing Wage Rates applied to it. If there are additional costs that will be involved in the project, they need to know where the additional monies will come from and a commitment from that entity that it will absorb the additional

costs. The county receives Allocation money in the fall of 2019 and the projects will be completed between roughly January 1, 2020 and December 31, 2021. All non-residential construction and improvements must meet or exceed State Building Codes. Paving, sidewalks, things of that nature, an engineer has to certify that they will have a useful life in excess of 8 years. Fire departments must provide a complete list of equipment they need to meet specific Safety Requirements of the Industrial Commission of Ohio Relating to Fire Fighting. If a Fire Department is applying for funds, they must be serving an area that has 51% Low/Moderate Income. Mr. Hartle advised that if you want to buy playground equipment for a community park, then all of Carrollton has to have 51% LMI. Only the county can enter into contracts on behalf of the selected projects. If you are committing other funds toward the project, must include letters, resolutions, ordinances, etc. committing these funds. Attach letter from agencies that are requiring or mandating improvements, if applicable. Organizations other than local governments must submit a copy of their constitution and by-laws and a copy of their year-end income and expense reports. Non-profit organizations must submit a copy of the 501(c)(3) designation form. Mr. Modranski commented that the application was mailed out to all the township trustees, fiscal officers, as well as the village municipalities in the county several weeks ago. It was also sent to the parks district, senior center, and county home.

FAIR HOUSING ADMINISTRATION PROGRAM



Dale Hartle, President of the Ohio Regional Development Corporation spoke about Fair Housing. Mr. Hartle advised that wherever there are projects done as a result of federal or state dollars, there has to be information regarding Fair Housing. It is unlawful to refuse to sell, rent, finance or insure housing or property; to tell any person that housing is not available for inspection, sale, rent or lease; refuse to lend money for the purchase, construction, rehabilitation, repair or maintenance of housing or property; discriminate against any person in the terms and conditions of fire, extended coverage or homeowner's insurance; refuse to consider the income of both the husband and/or wife in the purchase of financing of housing or property; print, publish or circulate any statement or advertisement which would indicate a preference or establish limitation or deny any person membership in any multiple listing or real estate service because of race, color, national origin, religion, sex, disability or familial status. Ohio has an 8th class, can't discriminate against someone because they are in the military. Mr. Hartle advised that they will be meeting with township trustees and providing them with a presentation about Fair Housing.
