RESOLUTION #2020-29 A RESOLUTION MODIFYING COURTHOUSE OPERATIONS

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2020, Mike DeWine, Governor of the State of Ohio, declared a State of Emergency in response to the COVID-19 pandemic; and

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020 U.S. President Donald Trump declared a national emergency in response to the COVID-19 pandemic; and

WHEREAS, on March 22, 2020, Dr. Amy Acton, Ohio Department of Health Director issued a Stay at Home Order requiring all persons to stay at home unless engaged in essential work or activity; and

WHEREAS, on May 1, 2020, Dr. Amy Acton, Ohio Department of Health Director issued the Stay Safe Ohio Order continuing the Stay at Home Order; and

WHEREAS, on May 20, 2020, Dr. Amy Acton, Ohio Department of Health Director issued an order rescinding the Stay at Home order; and

WHEREAS, limiting public access to the Carroll County Courthouse is still necessary to protect the general public and county employees; and

WHEREAS, it necessary to balance the health and safety of the general public and county employees and the need of the public to perform essential functions in the Courthouse;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners, Carroll County, Ohio:

Section 1: The Courthouse will be open to the public Monday through Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

<u>Section 2:</u> Only those individuals over the age of 65, have a compromised immune system, or those with specific appointments may enter the Courthouse from 8:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m.

<u>Section 3:</u> All individuals entering the Courthouse shall be subject to a non-invasive scan for elevated body temperature. Any individual, including employees, with a temperature of 100 degrees Fahrenheit or higher will be denied access to the Courthouse.

Section 4: It is recommended, but not required, that facial masks be worn while in the Courthouse.

<u>Section 5:</u> Other elected officials and department leaders may follow these guidelines for outlining county buildings but are not required to.

<u>Section 6:</u> This order will be effective Monday, June 1, 2020 until the end the COVID-19 pandemic or ordered by this Board.

Section 7: This order shall supersede all previous orders modifying Courthouse operations.

BE IT RESOLVED FURTHER that this Board of Commissioners hereby finds and determines that all formal actions relative to the adoption of this resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Board and that all deliberations of this Board which resulted in this formal action were taken in meetings open to the public in full compliance with applicable legal requirements, including ORC 121.22.

CARROLL COUNTY COURTS Modification of Courthouse Operations Effective June 1, 2020

In the interest of public health, and in order to comply with Ohio Governor Mike DeWine's Executive Order, and the various Executive Orders of the Ohio Director of Public Health, the Courts will implement the following procedural changes beginning at 8:00AM on June 1, 2020,

- 1. The Courthouse will be open to the public Monday through Friday from 9:00AM to 3:00PM. Only those individuals over the age of 65, have a compromised immune system, or those with specific appointments may enter from 8:00AM to 9:00AM.
- 2. All individuals entering the Courthouse shall be subject to a non-invasive scan for elevated body temperature. Any individual, including employees, with an elevated temperature will be denied access to the Courthouse. It is highly recommended that facial masks be worn while in the courthouse.
- 3. Access MAY be temporarily refused by security staff to any visibly-ill person.
- 4. Any person who is not an attorney, prosecutor, law enforcement officer, plaintiff, defendant, subpoenaed witness, victim or victim advocate having business with the Courts may be limited to access to courtrooms and waiting areas.
- 5. Media shall have access in accordance with Ohio Sup. R. 12 per normal procedure.

This is an evolving situation and may change pursuant to federal, state, and local guidance and directives.
