Dawn Faulk, Carroll Golden Age Retreat Superintendent and Luke Kopyar, Performance Infrastructure Account Executive at Johnson Controls, Inc. appeared before the Board to discuss a ventilation project at the Carroll Golden Age Retreat (CGAR). Ms. Faulk advised that she is applying for a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) to install three air handlers outside of the building that will provide ionized air filtration within the facility. Ms. Faulk advised that they plan to filter the air in larger areas of the building where

residents will eventually be able to gather together and it will filter into smaller areas and help there as well. The system will filter air and kill viruses, mold and bacteria in the air and provide a safer environment within the building for the residents. Commissioner Wirkner asked if the system works against COVID-19. Ms. Faulk advised that while Johnson Controls is not responsible if COVID-19 is still within the building, the filtration system that has been chosen states that it prevents the spread of airborne infectious diseases such as influenza, SARS and SARS COVID-2 which is responsible for COVID-19. Ms. Faulk advised that the study was done May 5, 2020 and the system did act effectively against the virus COVID-19. Ms. Faulk advised that she feels this system will be a benefit to the residents and the facility presently and in the future as well. Mr. Kopyar advised that four air handling units will be installed that are equipped with bipolar ionization by AtmosAir. This will provide positive and negative ions that go into the air space and attach to bacteria, viruses, allergens and pollutants in the air and help kill those contaminants. Mr. Kopyar advised that the system will clean the air, provide fresh air and continually ventilate the space. Commissioner Ohler asked how much the project will cost. Mr. Kopyar advised the project is estimated to be \$1.2 million but in order to apply for the grant there needs to be a certified cost estimate, which is why he is here today. Mr. Kopyar advised that the grant does not require any matching funds. Mr. Kopyar presented the Project Development Agreement to Commissioner Wirkner.
