### COMMUNITY HOUSING IMPACT AND PRESERVATION GRANT

Dale W. Hartle, President of Ohio Regional Development Corporation (ORDC) appeared before the Board to discuss the 2018 and 2020 Community Housing Impact and Preservation (CHIP) grants. Mr. Hartle advised that the 2018 CHIP grant was given a one-year extension. This grant was supposed to end October 31, 2020 and has been extended until October 31, 2021. Mr. Hartle advised that five owner rehabilitations were required for the 2018 grant. Currently, four of the rehabs are complete and the fifth rehab should be completed within a week. Mr. Hartle advised that Carroll County had committed to do nine home repair projects and 16 projects have been completed. Mr. Hartle advised that ORDC is working on closing out the Tenant Based Rental Assistance (TBRA) program. Mr. Hartle advised that the TBRA was amended from \$22,000.00 down to \$5,500.00 due to lack of use, and the funds were used in the other two grant areas. Mr. Hartle advised that the 2018 grant has gone very well and is essentially complete. Mr. Hartle advised that Carroll County was not awarded a CHIP grant for 2020. Mr. Hartle advised that the state advised his office that the application was good, however Carroll County did not receive funding due to three past performance issues. Mr. Hartle advised that there were findings on the monitoring visit for the 2016 CHIP grant, an issue with completion of the 2016 CHIP grant and an issue with a past allocation grant, which is a formula type of grant. Mr. Hartle advised that ORDC did not administer these past grants, so he does not know what the exact issues were, but his office will try to find out. Mr. Hartle advised that points were taken off of the 2020 grant application because of those three issues and now the slate is wiped clean. Carroll County can apply for the 2022 CHIP grant in the spring of 2021. Mr. Hartle advised that ORDC would like to apply for the 2021 grant and a Request for Proposals (RFP) will need to be done to choose an administrator. Mr. Hartle advised that if Carroll County is willing to begin the RFP process, ORDC will send over the information needed. Commissioner Ohler advised that he sees no reason why the Board will not move forward with that initiative when the time comes. Mr. Hartle advised that it takes several weeks to go through the RPF process and then do a contract with whomever is selected and ORDC is just trying to get ahead of the game so they can begin writing the grant after the first of the year. Mr. Hartle advised that writing a grant is a time-consuming process. Commissioner Wirkner asked Christopher R. Modranski, Clerk if he could have an RFP ready for Thursday's meeting. Mr. Modranski advised that Ronald Nuzzolillo, Jr., Assistant Clerk I worked with Scott Hillis from ORDC on the previous RFP and he will get it ready. Mr. Modranski advised that he received an email from Ohio Mid-Eastern Governments Association (OMEGA) on Friday advising that the Office of Community Development plans to eliminate the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) allocation program and reallocate those resources to the CDBG competitive program. Mr. Modranski advised that CDBG allocation program provides many resources for smaller communities, and Carroll County has utilized it for several paving projects and most recently, several small projects at the Senior Citizens center. Mr. Modranski advised that OMEGA has provided a sample letter to send to the Director of the Ohio Development Services Agency and our state legislature to let them know that Carroll County would like to see the CDBG allocation program continue. Mr. Hartle advised that he was in a three hour Zoom meeting with the state about this matter and he advised that the whole reason is due to Congress reducing the amount of CDBG dollars going to the states. Mr. Hartle advised that the general consensus at the meeting was that everyone wants to see the allocation program go forward and the state is onboard with that as well, but it will just depend on what comes out in the 2021 federal budget. Mr. Hartle advised that every community he works with wants more CDBG dollars and would be happy to exchange CDBG dollars for home dollars because there is a lot more latitude with them. Commissioner Wirkner asked the Board if they wanted to support a letter in support of the CDBG allocation program. Mr. Hartle advised that he hopes the new Congress will be more favorable to more CDBG dollars.
