Jeannette Wierzbicki, Executive Director and Kennedy Webb-Blakely, Communications Manager at Ohio Mid-Eastern Governments Association (OMEGA) appeared before the Board to discuss the goals, operations and mission of OMEGA. Ms. Webb advised that OMEGA handles ten counties in the mideastern region of Ohio. Ms. Webb presented the 2019 Annual Report which includes a letter from the Executive Director, a list of the member governments, membership meetings, the DDAA/NADO Policy Conference in Washington, D.C., a list of the OMEGA Executive Board members, the Financial Report, a list of grants and outcomes for ARC/GOA projects, information about the Regional Transportation Planning Organization, an update on the Regional Coordinated Council, a list of staff members, responsibilities and contact information, and more. Ms. Wierzbicki gave an update on the Broadband Feasibility Study which is funded by the economic development administration and the CARES funding that OMEGA received. Ms. Wierzbicki advised that OMEGA has chosen Tom Reed of Reed Consulting to perform the feasibility study, which will be completed in three phases. The first phase will be data gathering including existing service, types of service, and service providers. Mr. Reed will also look at the demand for broadband service including household and population density, business density, and school and healthcare density. Once those areas are defined, Mr. Reed will look at deployment strategies and develop short- and long-term solutions as well as a plan to implement and provide services to unserved areas. Mr. Reed is well versed in the FCC policies and fallacies, as well as broadband grants and Governor DeWine's initiative to provide \$250 million over the next two years to broadband expansion. The lack of broadband in many areas is a key concern for everyone during the pandemic. Ms. Wierzbicki advised that OMEGA has retained the Montrose Group to serve as their Regional Recovery Coordinator and they will be doing outreach to each county, and will assist with whatever the county needs for economic recovery. Ms. Wierzbicki advised that OMEGA is currently helping the Carroll Golden Age Retreat with their Community Development Block Grant - Coronavirus Response (CDBG-CV) grant for the heating, ventilation and air conditioning system improvements. Ms. Wierzbicki advised that the grant application is ready to go and once the two public hearings are completed in March, the application will be submitted. Ms. Wierzbicki advised that OMEGA is assisting Carrollton Exempted Village School District on their safe walking and biking to school initiative and OMEGA will be submitting a grant application for sidewalks along State Route 332. They are asking for the maximum amount of \$400,000.00 for the project. OMEGA is also working with Ohio Department of Transportation Jobs & Commerce and OhioSE to find viable funding strategies to improve Mirth Road and Meter Road for a growing business. Ms. Wierzbicki advised that there is a meeting next week

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to review the Engineer's cost estimate and the funding sources that have been identified. Ms. Wierzbicki advised that some of the past projects that OMEGA has assisted with have been traffic counts on county roads, drainage on State Route 43 in the Village of Minerva and improving Industrial Drive. Ms. Wierzbicki advised that OMEGA continues to advocate for and help with the Route 30 project. Right now, they are working on the economic justifications for the abandoned mine land program which will help with the mine remediation which is required for the first phase, which is the bypass around East Canton. Ms. Wierzbicki advised that OMEGA will submit that report next week, as they are waiting for tonight's public meeting to be completed. Commissioner Wirkner advised that Carroll County residents are encouraged to tune in to the public meeting tonight. Even though no Carroll County lands are in the next phase, Carroll County has input because we are users of Route 30. Commissioner Wirkner asked Mr. Nuzzolillo to have the information for the public meeting ready at the end of OMEGA's presentation. Mr. Nuzzolillo advised that he will put the link in the comments on the Facebook page. Commissioner Wirkner advised that Ms. Wierzbicki has been a great help with the Route 30 project. Commissioner Modranski advised that it is always a pleasure to work with the staff at OMEGA. Commissioner Modranski advised that the projects are always large scale and the staff always has a good understanding of the project which is very helpful. Ms. Wierzbicki advised that OMEGA appreciates Carroll County's support through dues and participation at their Board meetings. Ms. Wierzbicki advised that she is cautiously optimistic that OMEGA'S in-person meetings can resume in August. Commissioner Modranski advised that once the Board can meet in-person again, he wants to schedule a meeting in Carroll County.
