Tonya Myers, Senior Citizens Friendship Center Director appeared before the Board to provide an update on several items of business. Ms. Myers advised that Friendship Center began hosting in-house activities again in June, including exercising, Senior Strollers and crafts. A parking lot event was sponsored by McFadden Insurance. Ms. Myers advised that Jimmy's Backyard BBQ food truck was there and Spikeman played music. There were 98 residents in attendance and a great time was had by all. Ms. Myers

advised that in July, Tuesday and Thursday lunches are being served in-house. Seniors still have to RSVP for in-house lunch just as they did pre-COVID. Ms. Myers advised that in August she plans to be back to normal as much as possible, including coffee and donuts in the morning and light breakfast on Fridays. Ms. Myers advised that they have had great success with the curbside pick-up, and she plans to continue curbside pickup as long as the Area Agency on Aging approves the program. Ms. Myers advised that her staff is preparing 285 to 376 meals per day plus frozen meals. The Friendship Center received a grant that allowed them to purchase a flash freezer so they have no waste anymore. The staff is able to flash freeze leftovers in freezer containers to send out to clients who like to have a meal for the weekends. Ms. Myers advised that there is approximately \$18,000.00 left of the PY19 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds that needs to be spent by the end of August. Ms. Myers advised that she is currently waiting on estimates for cement work, heat tape for gutters over the entrance, emergency exit LED signs and a large closet for storage in the small dining room. Ms. Myers advised that her office has made some security upgrades to the entrance of the small dining room. In the past, staff and clients would use this entrance because of the handicap accessibility. Ms. Myers advised that she was fearful that a client and a staff member would have a collision while the staff member was trying to load their van. Ms. Myers advised that the entrance to the large dining room / rental room now has handicap accessibility and clients will enter the building through this entrance while the staff will continue to use the entrance to the small dining room. Ms. Myers advised that the Friendship Center will be closed the week of the Fair, July 19-23, 2021. Clients will receive a full week of meals along with their regular delivery on Friday, July 16, 2021. Ms. Myers advised that she has more volunteers coming in that day to help with the increase in deliveries. The Friendship Center will receive their regular reimbursement for these meals plus the client's donation. Ms. Myers advised that her Board met and made the decision to observe Juneteenth on Friday, August 13, 2021. Ms. Myers advised that they do not want the seniors to go four days with no meal delivery. Ms. Myers advised that during COVID, socialization became a large issue for many seniors. The Friendship Center received Title XX funds to create a Welcome and Wellness Program. Ms. Myers advised that she has one staff member dedicated to the Welcome and Wellness Program. When a client signs up for meals, the staff member goes out to meet the client to do their paperwork and find out dietary restrictions. The staff member will do porch visits, help with paperwork such a Medicare or refer them to an agency that can help them, such as Hospice or HARCATUS. Ms. Myers advised that there is still some extra funding available for things such as emergency lawn care or small handyman projects. Ms. Myers advised that she and Stephanie Babe are certified Alzheimer's support coordinators and will be starting an Alzheimer's support group on the second Tuesday of every month at 1:00 p.m. in the basement of the Friendship Center. Ms. Myers advised that the COVID pandemic has been very difficult on her staff and clients. Ms. Meyers advised that her staff is so much happier being able to see the clients. Ms. Myers advised that she has the best staff, and it is so rewarding to have the seniors coming back. Commissioner Wirkner advised that during the COVID crisis, the Commissioners' office received several calls from area seniors wondering when the Friendship Center would be opening. Commissioner Wirkner advised the callers that reopening would be based on the COVID numbers. Ms. Meyers advised that the rental room is the room they have been using for everything so her office has not been renting that room out. Ms. Myers advised that her Board suggested not renting it out for 2021 to help keep the seniors safe. Commissioner Wirkner advised that it is the Senior Center and the seniors come first.
