Dawn Faulk, Carroll Golden Age Retreat (CGAR) Superintendent appeared before the Board to provide the monthly update for October 2022. Ms. Faulk advised the Board of Elections was at the facility on Wednesday, October 26, 2022 to assist all residents who wished to vote with their absentee ballots. Ms. Faulk advised the new bipolar ionization HVAC system will be ready for the test run on November 1, 2022. The system will not be able to be used until the new fire alarm system is installed because the current fire alarm system cannot be tied into the new bipolar ionization HVAC system. Ms. Faulk thanked the Carroll Mason Lodge 124 for their donation of 18 mums that were planted outside of the building. Ms. Faulk expressed her appreciation to the Ruritans for regularly bringing over dessert for the residents. Ms. Faulk advised she attended the Chamber of Commerce's Dessert Extravaganza, which had a record turnout. There have been three new admissions for the month October. There are currently 10 males and 26 females for a total of 36 residents. Commissioner Modranski advised the bipolar ionization project has been paid for with Community Development Block Grant – Coronavirus Relief funds (CDBG-CV), and the fire alarm project will be partially paid for with CDBG funds.

Dawn Faulk, Carroll Golden Age Retreat (CGAR) Superintendent appeared before the Board to present revised policies for the dress code and cell phones at CGAR. Ms. Faulk advised the policies have been revised to bring them up to current standards and have been reviewed by an attorney at the County Risk Sharing Authority (CORSA). Ms. Faulk advised the cell phone policy gives more guidance as to when cell phones may be carried on an employee's person. This is due to CGAR previously having landlines and the phones now run on wifi. If the wifi is down, there is no telephone service in the building. Ms. Faulk advised staff does not carry cell phones,

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but for safety reasons, they would need to when the wifi is down. As a general rule, the wifi is only down one or two times per year. Ms. Faulk advised the dress code policy has been updated to reflect the current uniform requirements and to address the wearing of fragrances. Commissioner Wirkner advised he is uncomfortable with the cell phone policy because of potential emergency situations. Commissioner Wirkner stated he has a problem with employees not having their cell phone on their person during working hours. Commissioner Wirkner advised he has no problem with disciplinary action being put in place for employees who have their phones out during working hours. Ms. Faulk advised there are issues with phones due to the cameras and recording devices creating a Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) violation. The nurses on each shift generally carry a cell phone, and there are 32 phones throughout the whole building. Ms. Faulk advised that employees having their cell phones on their person all the time will lead to issues and constant reprimands. Ms. Faulk asked for recommendations for discipline for first, second, and third offenses. Commissioner Wirkner advised the discipline is up to Ms. Faulk, he is just not comfortable removing the cell phones from an employee's person. Ms. Faulk advised that currently, employees can keep their cell phones in their purse and are encouraged to tell family members who may need to contact them to call CGAR directly. In the case of family illnesses, employees may carry their cell phone with permission from Ms. Faulk or their direct supervisor. Ms. Faulk advised that she sees the safety concern, but knows it will be a constant reprimand issue and what does she reprimand employees with when staffing is a constant issue. Commissioner Modranski advised that he sees both points that are being made. *****
