Mrs. Trbovich opened the meeting and asked for approval on previous minutes from January 26, 2022.

Motion was made by Mrs. Rinkes and seconded by Mrs. Myers to approve minutes from January 26, 2022 with changes, all in favor, motion carried.

***Changes include the term of Gary Tope from two years to one year that way all are on the same expired term for the TAC Appeals Committee members.

OLD BUSINESS:

- Operating hours did resume to normal 6a-6p on February 28, 2022
- Mask mandate was to continue through May 3, 2022 however a new Directive was issued and took effect on April 19, 2022 lifting the mandate. They are more than welcome to continue to wear them, but not a requirement any longer. We are still continuing to disinfect vehicles.

NEW BUSINESS:

Mrs. Trbovich advised she is working on 2023 Rural Transit Application – due May 13, 2022

- Applying for the following:
 - Ohio Transit Partnership Program (OTP2)

- 5311 Operating 50% and Maintenance 80%
 - 5339 Bus & Bus Facilities Grant – 2 MMV (replacements) – Grant Award
- New hires
 - Part time drivers – we just recently had one of our part-time employees resign to take a full-time job elsewhere with benefits. I also, just had another part-time employee put in his resignation/retirement to be effective May 24, 2022. There are 2 part-time drivers who are interested in full-time if it comes available. At the moment we are still operating just fine so we are going to wait awhile before posting for these positions.
 - Fleet and Facility Maintenance Specialist – previous employee resigned 2/10/22 therefore we posted for a part-time in which we were not successful in filling that position – so we then posted for full-time and we are currently in the process of doing interviews (6) – 2 were done yesterday and the other 4 will be done on Thursday. Hopefully we will have a recommendation for the Board by the end of next week.

Mrs. Offenberger questioned if there was a substitute that can work. Mrs. Trbovich replied that we have one at this time.

OTHER BUSINESS:

Mrs. Peoples advised that our vehicles are working well with the cameras installed in all of the vehicles. She is still learning the software, but other than that all seems to be working well. They are for everyone's safety in case of vandalism, accident, etc. SEAT out of Zanesville done the uninstall and install of the cameras and cradlepoint that works as Wi-Fi for the cameras and tablets.

Mrs. Myers mentioned that Carroll County Council on Aging (CCCOA) had a problem which they had a meeting with one Commissioner, Transit, Veterans, and CCCOA. The meeting was in regards to a veteran who was going to Cleveland and stopping to use the restroom on the way. The Veterans were previously in a contract with Carroll County Transit and now they are not and paying general public cost even though money was returned back to the Commissioners.

Mrs. Myers advised they are assisting more on the phone with seniors that they are helping with the right services over an assessment. There is a Welcome and Wellness Program coordinated by Heather Smalley where they will do assessments and any referrals to get more information. It can come from anyone with concerns on a resident/elderly client who is 60 years old and above. It will help identify their needs, but only can help if they want it or the guardian applies. She advised that the Carroll County Health Department offers a program called No Place Like Home. It is called Carroll County I-team where they are like a care coordination program that is for all ages to help assist throughout the community to identify what services are needed. There are resources that are offered throughout the county that she would like to share (attached).

Mrs. Offenberger expressed her feelings that we are a small county and does not prefer the center-based call center. Discussions were expressed by others how we all know our clients/riders and their special needs.

Next meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, July 27, 2022 @ 9:30 a.m.

Motion was made by Mrs. Myers, seconded by Mr. Offenberger to adjourn @ 10:25 a.m., all in favor, motion carried.

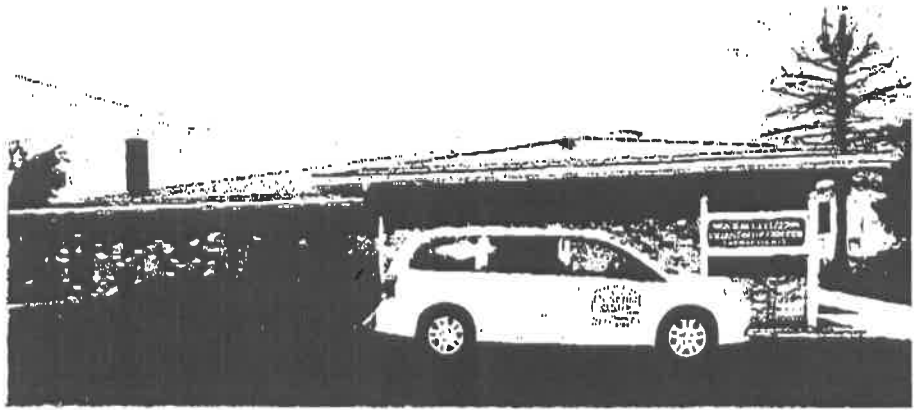
