WHEREAS, on March 30, 2023, Brian J. Wise, County Engineer, issued a letter stating that the proposed annexation petition was reviewed and the description follows the map and appears to be accurate with county records; and

WHEREAS, neither the Village of Minerva nor Brown Township filed a resolution or ordinance with the Board of Commissioners consenting or objecting to the annexation petition and therefore, it is deemed consent; and

WHEREAS, based on the foregoing, this Board has determined, based upon a preponderance of the substantial, reliable, and probative evidence on the whole record, that each of the following conditions set forth in ORC 709.023 (E) (1) through (7) has been met including:

- 1. The petition does meet all the requirements set forth in, and was filed in the manner provided in, section 709.021 of the Revised Code.
- 2. The persons who signed the petition are owners of the real estate located in the territory proposed for annexation and constitute all of the owners of real estate in that territory.
- 3. The territory proposed for annexation does not exceed five hundred acres.
- 4. The territory proposed for annexation shares a contiguous boundary with the municipal corporation to which annexation is proposed for a continuous length of at least five percent of the perimeter of the territory proposed for annexation.
- 5. The annexation will not create an unincorporated area of the township that is completely surrounded by the territory proposed for annexation.
- The municipal corporation to which annexation is proposed has agreed to provide to the territory proposed for annexation the services specified in the Statement of Services Ordinance No. 56-22, passed on January 24, 2023 by the Village of Minerva Village Council.
- 7. If a street or highway will be divided or segmented by the boundary line between the township and the municipal corporation as to create a road maintenance problem, the municipal corporation to which annexation is proposed has agreed as a condition of the annexation to assume the maintenance of that street or highway or to otherwise correct the problem. As used in this section, "street" or "highway" has the same meaning as in section 4511.01 of the Revised Code.

WHEREAS, said annexation petition meets all the requirements set forth, and information provided by all parties were duly considered and it is deemed right and proper for the Board to grant the annexation petition;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by The Board of Commissioners of Carroll County, Ohio that the petition for the annexation of 11.627 acres of land located in Brown Township in Carroll County, Ohio into the Village of Minerva, Ohio, be and is hereby granted in accordance with the law, said territory being fully described in the attached Exhibit A.

Sometimes there is money left in some line items, and sometimes the money runs short in other line items. The last seven to ten years, the state has allowed JFS to transfer extra money to other counties. If she has money left in one of her funds, the agreement allows her to help another county. Ms. Offenberger advised that her first money is ending in June and she has a little extra money in some pots. She is on target to not have Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) funds in September, which is unusual. Ms. Offenberger is looking to get TANF money and potentially do a clothing voucher program. Right now, Ms. Offenberger does not have any money to do that, so she needs to trade some funds around and see if she can get money to do the program. Commissioner Wirkner asked how often does Carroll County receive money. Ms. Offenberger advised that as a small county, she tends to transfer more money than what she receives. Ms. Offenberger advised that she is conservative and does not like to go in the negative. Some of the funds she gives away are small pots of money. Commissioner Modranski asked if the money is not used, does it go back to state. Ms. Offenberger advised she can return it to the state, or she can help another county out by doing an inter-county transfer. Commissioner Modranski asked if Ms. Offenberger returns money, does she start getting less. Ms. Offenberger advised there is concern that receiving less money could potentially happen. Ms. Offenberger advised that this year more TANF money was spent. Ms. Offenberger advised that she has excess Income Maintenance (IM) control money, which is a very limited pot of money that is very restrictive. Counties want these funds and she is hoping to do an intercounty transfer to get TANF funds, which are more flexible.
