Mr. Wise advised approximately \$500,000.00. This is the main funding that the salt and road materials are paid from. Commissioner Wirkner stated that the levy helps fund the midnight road deputy, as well.

## IN THE MATTER OF PY23 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM (CDBG) PUBLIC HEARING #2

# 9:33 AM

Commissioner Modranski advised that the time has arrived for the second public hearing for the PY 23 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program. Susan Moore, Community Development Specialist for the Ohio Regional Development Corporation (ORDC) opened the public hearing for the PY23 CDBG Program at 9:33 a.m. Ms. Moore advised that since the first hearing, applications have been received for this program. To be eligible, projects need to benefit low to moderate income (LMI) residents. The LMI benefit can be a direct benefit, limited clientele, or elimination of slum or blight. The 2023 allocation is \$150,000.00. Carroll County will be doing one project and one planning activity. Ms. Moore advised that she received applications for projects that did not qualify because they did not meet one of the required national objectives. One project application was received that did qualify, and that is the Village of Dellroy Community Center Improvements. Ms. Moore advised that \$114,000.00 will be used for improvements. The Village of Dellroy completed income surveys that showed that their LMI percentage is 63.1%. The projects include a new roof, Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) door openers, new flooring, electrical upgrades, plumbing upgrades, and protective fencing around their heating, ventilation and air conditioning (HVAC) equipment and the new generator. Ms. Moore advised that security cameras will be added if there is money available after the improvements. The improvements will improve the safety of the center, as well as the quality of the center and the community activities. Ms. Moore advised that the PY21 CDBG grant is helping provide a generator for the center. This will allow the center to be used as an emergency center with heating and cooling that is necessary for the community. \$6,000 will be used for a Planning Activity. This will be the Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing Choice which is a study that must be completed every five years. This study is required in order to receive grant funds, so grant funds can be used to pay for the study. The study is due in 2024. The remaining \$30,000 will be used for administration and the Fair Housing program. Administration includes applying for the grants, securing contractors, completing the projects and everything in between. Fair Housing is a community outreach program to disseminate information throughout the community about what Fair Housing rights are. If a resident feels that they are having a Fair Housing issue, they can call ORDC and speak to the Fair Housing specialist. Fair Housing issues are directed to the Fair Housing commission. If it is a tenant landlord issue, ORDC provides resources. The CDBG application is due to the State by June 14, 2023. Ms. Moore advised she is on target to meet that deadline. Grant awards begin September 1, 2023. The projects must be completed by August 31, 2025 and the program completion date is October 31, 2025. Ms. Moore advised there will be a public hearing for the Neighborhood Revitalization Grant (NRG) on Monday, June 12, 2023 at 9:30 a.m. Commissioner Modranski asked if the June 12, 2023 hearing is the first public hearing. Ms. Moore advised that it is the second hearing. The first public hearing for the NRG was combined with the hearing held on April 10, 2023. Ms. Moore advised that the NRG application is also due on June 14, 2023. Commissioner Modranski asked what other applications were received for the CDBG grant. Ms. Moore advised that the Carrollton Village Fire Department applied for equipment, but they did not meet the LMI requirement. Ms. Moore advised that the State is still using older census data. The State is supposed to be begin using the new data next year. Ms. Moore advised once that data comes out, she will review the information and see if the Fire Department will be able to apply on the next grant cycle. Commissioner Modranski advised that the Village could do income surveys to determine LMI. Ms. Moore advised that is correct, but there was not enough time to complete the surveys. Commissioner Modranski asked if there were any other applicants. Ms. Moore advised that she talked to a couple people about potential projects, but upon review the projects did not meet the requirements. Commissioner Modranski asked if an applicant was wanting to make a building ADA compliant, does the applicant have to own the building. Ms. Moore advised that the easy answer is yes, however there are situations where it can be done.
