Ms. Bolanz advised that October is Dysautonomia Awareness Month in the state of Ohio. Ms. Bolanz read information about Dysautonomia and Postural Orthostatic Tachycardia Syndrome (POTS) and thanked the Commissioners for their support. Ms. Bolanz asked the commissioners to adopt a proclamation declaring October Dysautonomia Awareness Month in Carroll County. Ms. Bolanz invited the residents that were present if they would like to share anything. Meghyn Spencer advised that she was diagnosed with POTS in 2014. Ms. Spencer advised that even though medication cannot fix her symptoms, she is thankful that people have been made more aware of POTS. Sean Speedy advised that days after receiving a COVID vaccine, he developed issues with his pulse and blood pressure. Mr. Speedy advised that it was very hard to get a diagnosis because all his tests were normal, but his eye doctor told him his symptoms were from POTS. Mr. Speedy shared his struggles regarding this rare disorder. Mary Gainer advised that her daughter, Grace, who was also present, was diagnosed with Dysautonomia when she was seven. Ms. Gainer advised that it causes Grace's blood pressure to be very low, and she must take medication 30 minutes before getting out of bed. Ms. Gainer advised that it has been a struggle and she is glad that more awareness is being brought to light about Dysautonomia. Ms. Gainer advised that not enough doctors are educated about this disorder. Ms. Bolanz advised that she was recently in Washington, DC with Dysautonomia International, and they are advocating for the National Institute of Health (NIH) to give them more money for research and funding. Ms. Bolanz advised viewers that they could find more information about Dysautonomia and POTS on www.dysautonomiainternational.org. Ms. Bolanz advised that previously, it was taking four to six years for patients to get diagnosed. Teresa Spencer advised that she had to take her daughter to the Mayo Clinic to get diagnosed due to lack of awareness. Joyce Yost, Elyza's grandmother, expressed how difficult it has been. Commissioner Modranski read the proclamation. Commissioner Leggett thanked the group for sharing their knowledge and advised that he will support them in anyway he can. Commissioner Modranski advised that Ms. Bolanz has been coming to the Board for many years, and her awareness efforts are working. Commissioner Modranski said he has an appreciation for mothers, and that without them pushing continually it makes so much difference. Commissioner Wirkner asked how well the insurance companies cooperate. Ms. Bolanz advised that there is no FDA approved treatment for Dysautonomia, so alternative medications are used. Ms. Bolanz advised that she has had to fight with the insurance company to pay for Elyza's medications. Ms. Spencer advised that she has to fight every 6 months to get her daughter's medication paid for. Commissioner Modranski advised that it's inspiring that so many of them made it to the meeting today. Ms. Gainer advised that Commissioner Modranski' sister was Grace's school nurse, and both she and Grace appreciate the job she did.
