A MODERN TAKE ON APRIL FOOLS

In more modern times, the media, sports and entertainment, and corporate brands have emerged to play a large role in general pranks and April Fools' Day jokes and hoaxes. Here are some of the biggest doozies:

- In 1957, the BBC reported that a record spaghetti crop was being enjoyed in Switzerland. Footage was aired showing people harvesting long, thin strands of pasta from the trees.
- In January 1961, research university Caltech, located in Pasadena, pulled a fast one at the Rose Bowl football game between the Washington Huskies and the Minnesota Golden Gophers. Using Washington cheerleaders as unsuspecting mules, colored cards were handed out to fans in selected seats in the Huskies' section of the stadium. The fans were told to hold the cards up at halftime to spell Huskies, but when they did, the cards revealed the word CALTECH, which wasn't even playing in the game.
- In November 1969, Rolling Stone music critic Greil Marcus published a spoof piece about big-name rock stars forming supergroups. He presented a gushing review of a nonexistent bootleg album by the fabricated "Masked Marauders." This fake, underground supergroup was said to have been composed of Bob Dylan, Mick Jagger, John Lennon, Paul McCartney, and George Harrison.
- On April 1, 1985, Sports Illustrated writer George Plimpton reported in a made-up article that a rookie pitcher named Sidd Finch could throw a fastball over 168 miles per hour. Sidd Finch was pure fiction, but many readers believed the story.
- On April 1, 1992, nearly 18 years after President Richard Nixon resigned in disgrace, National Public Radio ran a spot with a look-alike actor playing Nixon announcing that he was running for president again.
- On April 1, 1996, the fast-food chain Taco Bell announced it had entered into an agreement to purchase the Liberty Bell and that this historic symbol of American democracy would be renamed the Taco Liberty Bell. Millions were duped.
- Two years later, in 1998, Burger King advertised a new sandwich—the "Left-Handed Whopper." Throngs of clueless customers requested the sandwich.
- On April Fools' Day 2004, the National Public Radio show All Things Considered ran a spoof about the U.S. Postal Service initiating a new "portable zip codes" program. Like the option to maintain an existing phone number when one moves to a new residence, USPS claimed this program would allow people to maintain their existing zip code.
- In 2008, the BBC introduced a video clip of flying penguins as part of a new series called Miracles of Evolution. The narrator of the segment explained that the penguins flew to the tropical rainforests of South America in order to escape the cold, harsh conditions of Antarctica.
