

The Board continues work on our strategic plan. I am excited that we have the resources to address our waiting list for waiver funding. The Board approved ten additional Level 1 waivers and the SSA department is working on completing the paperwork to address people currently on our waiting list. We were able to update the phone system to Voice over Internet Protocol with twice the internet speed, while also saving money every month with a new Spectrum agreement. Ohio Network for Innovations recently purchased a new home which brings the housing stock to five homes. The Board has

named Jessica Lafferty as Early Intervention Service Coordinator and hired Tyra Warrington as Developmental Specialist.

The Board purchased two new smartboards for the classrooms. Employee Engagement Surveys were completed on March 31, 2025. Management is working on addressing issues with compensation, broken equipment, training, changing our evaluation process, advancement opportunities, and updating policies. The Board continues to partner with Ohio State University Extension to bring programs such as cooking to providers and People First Chapter.

I want to take a moment to address a concern I have in this current political climate. No, I am not going to get political but just mention some facts. I have real concerns about the proposed November ballot issue to eliminate property taxes. Most of the County Board funding is through Carroll County voter approved property taxes. We have a 3.6 mill operating levy that is scheduled to be on the ballot for renewal in November 2028. The Board also has a one mill school levy scheduled for renewal November 2032. These levies generate funds only on the property values of when they were voted in (2008 for the 3.6 mill and 2004 for the one mill). If property taxes are eliminated there is no proposed tax replacement that will

replace the funds to continue County Board

services.

May 30, 2025, was a bittersweet day. We said goodbye and congratulations to Vivian DeFilippo, a 23 year employee. Vivian held many positions while working for the Board. She was a workshop specialist, a van driver, a job coach and in later years moved to Carroll Hills School as a classroom aid. Vivian truly cares for the adults and students we serve. While attending her retirement party, Vivian's attention to detail and her avid rule following was mentioned as characteristics having positive impact on coworkers and those she provided services for. Thank you, Vivian, for your dedication, we wish you well in retirement.




