All answers contain the word red, white, or blue.

- 1. What red flower is worn to honor fallen soldiers? Answer: Red poppy. The red poppy became a symbol of remembrance after World War I, inspired by the poem "In Flanders Fields."
- 2. What team did Pete Rose and Johnny Bench play together on? Answer: Cincinnati Reds. Rose and Bench were key members of the "Big Red Machine," a dominant team in the 1970s.
- 3. What common kitchen ingredient is made from grain alcohol and known for its sharp, acidic flavor? Answer: White vinegar. It is used in cooking, cleaning, and pickling due to its strong acidity.
- 4. What red fruit is often used to make summer pies and jams? Answer: Strawberry or red raspberry. Both are high in fiber and antioxidants and are a favorite during berry-picking season. Some varieties of rhubarb are also red, but botanically, rhubarb is classified as a vegetable.
- 5. What 1968 song by the band Cream uses vivid color imagery to describe curtains, a room, tigers, and horses? Answer: "White Room." The opening line is "in the white room with black curtains near the station." Silver horses and yellow tigers are also mentioned. The song is known for its psychedelic rock sound and features Eric Clapton.
- 6. What crustacean, famous in Maryland cuisine, turns red when cooked? Answer: Blue crab. Although it has blue claws when alive, it turns red when cooked.
- 7. What historic trade route between Minnesota and Manitoba took its name from a reddish-colored river? Answer: Red River Trail. The Red River was named for the iron-rich soil that gives its water a reddish tint.
- 8. What type of wine is made from dark grapes? Answer: Red wine. Its color comes from grape skins fermenting with the juice.
- What colorful trademark, introduced in 1936, was designed to help customers identify Levi's authentic jeans? Answer: The red tab. The red tab is a small fabric label on the back pocket, used to distinguish Levi's from imitators.
- 10. What fruit is commonly used in muffins and pies? Answer: Blueberry. Despite the name, it is more purple than blue.
